**JOINT CUSTODY PLAN**

**COMES NOW** the Petitioner, [REDACTED] and the Respondent, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and jointly and respectfully submit this Joint Custody Plan (“Plan”) agreed upon by and between the parties hereto with supporting affidavits for the Court’s consideration and state as follows: That the terms and provisions of said Plan are in the best interests of the minor child of the parties hereto, namely: [REDACTED] born March of 2004; that both of said parties hereto are fit and proper persons and parents, physically and psychologically, to be granted physical and legal care, custody and control of said minor child as hereinafter set forth; that said parties hereto respectfully pray the Court to approve and adopt this Plan as the Court’s order for the exercise of joint child care, custody and control of said minor child by said parties hereto, all pursuant to 43 O.S. § 109, alleging and stating further as follows:

1. That both parties hereto should and shall have equal rights and responsibilities to said minor child, and neither party's rights shall be superior.

2. That both parties hereto should and shall reasonably confer with one another by the most reasonable and appropriate method, and should and shall share decision-making authority as to important decisions affecting the physical, mental and moral welfare and upbringing of said minor child to arrive at decisions promoting said minor child's best interests.

3. That both parties hereto should and shall attempt to decide jointly the following matters, to-wit:

- A. medical, dental and health care said minor child should or shall receive;
- B. schools which said minor child should or shall attend;
- C. summer camps and church schools and/or classes which said minor child should or shall attend;
- D. fashion and manner in which said minor child should or shall be disciplined;
- E. extent of any travel of said minor child away from home, including purpose, duration, mode, chaperon, etc.;
- F. religious instruction said minor child should or shall receive; and
- G. such other areas requiring decisions affecting the growth and development of said minor child.

4. That in order to assure continuing association between the minor child and his parents, and to best promote and foster continued parent-child companionship, the parties shall share physical custody as follows:

A. Regular Visitation: Respondent shall have visitation with the minor child every other weekend, from Friday evening until Sunday evening, with pick up and drop off occurring at Petitioner's residence unless a different location is agreed upon in advance by the parties.

B. Holidays: Pursuant to the attached schedule;

Summer Break: The parties shall continue with the regular visitation schedule during the summer, except that Respondent shall be entitled to seven (7) consecutive days of uninterrupted visitation with the child each summer. Respondent should provide notice to the Petitioner of his intended week of summer visitation at least thirty (30) days in advance.

C. Other: Variation or modification of any custodial periods described herein and/or such additional custodial periods as are agreed to in advance by the parties in writing (emails and text messages may serve as "writings").

D. That both parties hereto shall be mindful and considerate of the child's school activities, peer activities and associations, and the wishes of the child. In the event of a conflict respecting physical custody or visitation as hereinabove provided, both parties hereto shall work together reasonably in advance to arrange for alternate periods of physical custody or visitation if necessary.

5. That in connection with said custody rights, if the parent exercising custody is going to be late or unable to exercise said custody, that parent shall notify the custodial parent within forty-eight (48) hours of said custody; FURTHER, if either parent is unable to make the child available for custody, that custodial

parent shall notify the other parent within forty-eight (48) hours of said custody or as soon as practical under the circumstances.

6. The parties agree that the child will continue to attend Town & Country School and that Petitioner shall pay 50%, and Respondent shall pay 50% of any school related expenses, including but not limited to books, tuition, uniform expenses, etc.

7. Each party has the right of first refusal to personally provide the child care services at no cost in the event the other party must make child care arrangements during his or her period of custody for periods of time exceeding six (6) hours.

8. That both Petitioner and Respondent shall notify each other of any medical problem regarding the parties' minor child requiring medical attention.

9. That both parties hereto agree that during the period each of them has physical custody of the child, that parent should and shall decide all normal, regular and routine matters concerning said child's welfare, and that each parent should and shall cooperate with one another in maintaining a mutually supportive arrangement regarding such normal, regular and routine matters.

10. That both parties hereto agree that the address and telephone number of one another, and those places where the minor child might be temporarily staying for more than a sleepover or visit with relatives who live in Oklahoma,

should and shall be known to each other at all times, and that each party-parent shall notify the other immediately of any illness, sickness or emergency that may arise while said minor child is in his or her physical custody.

11. That both parties hereto agree that in the event either party remarries, that party's spouse should and shall be apprised of the terms of this Plan, and that party should and shall exert every reasonable effort to ensure that his or her spouse honors and respects the terms, provisions and conditions of said Plan.

12. That each party shall keep the other reasonably informed when planning vacations involving the minor child, including where the child is going, where he will be staying, a general itinerary, and an expected arrival and departure date and time. Telephone contact shall not be restricted while either party is travelling.


13. That both parties agree that in the event of the death of either party, legal and physical custody of the minor child should and shall vest wholly and exclusively in the other party.

14. That any disagreement or dispute arising concerning the care, control, maintenance, decision-making or management of the child shall be reasonably discussed by and between the parties, and if determined by the parties to be incapable of resolution, that Kevin Gassaway (or another parent coordinator if

Kevin Gassaway is not available) shall be appointed as parenting coordinator upon application by either party, and that both parties waive their right to object to same.

**WHEREFORE**, Petitioner, [REDACTED] and Respondent, [REDACTED] jointly move the Court to approve the above and foregoing Joint Child Custody Plan as the Court's order in the best interests of the parties' minor child.

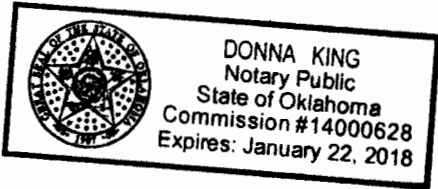

## HOLIDAY SCHEDULE

A parent whose regularly scheduled custodial period is interrupted by any Holiday period described in this schedule shall not be entitled to “make-up time.” If any Holiday period to which a parent is entitled occurs adjacent to a weekend the parent is exercising, then the Holiday attaches.

**Father’s Day:** Father shall exercise custody from 9:00 a.m. until 9:00 p.m.

**Mother’s Day:** Mother shall exercise custody from 9:00 a.m. until 9:00 a.m. the following day.

**Spring Break:** Spring Break shall be split in half with the exchange occurring on Wednesday at 1 p.m. The parties are to alternate the first and second half of Spring Break each year.

**Alternating Holidays:** All other holidays shall alternate according to the following schedule and shall take precedence over any regular school year or summer vacation schedule.

### Alternating Holiday Schedule – Even Years

#### Father

Easter: Sunday from 9:00 a.m. until 9:00 p.m.

July 4: From 9:00 a.m. until 9:00 p.m.

Fall Break: Two day school holiday, generally in October, from after school Wednesday (or the day school recesses) until 8:00 p.m. Sunday

Thanksgiving: From after school the day school recesses until 8:00 p.m. Sunday

#### Mother

Memorial Day: Monday from 9:00 a.m. until 9:00 a.m. the following day

Labor Day: Monday from 9:00 a.m. until 9:00 a.m. the following day

Halloween: From after school until 9:00 p.m.

Christmas: From the day school recesses until 8:00 p.m. Christmas Eve

Christmas: From 8:00 p.m. Christmas Eve until return to school

### Alternating Holiday Schedule – Odd Years

#### Father

Memorial Day: Monday from 9:00 a.m. until 9:00 p.m.

Labor Day: Monday from 9:00 a.m. until 9:00 p.m.

Halloween: From after school until 9:00 p.m.

Christmas: From the day school recesses until 8:00 p.m. Christmas Eve

#### Mother

Easter: Sunday from 9:00 a.m. until 9:00 a.m. the following day

July 4: From 9:00 a.m. until 9:00 a.m. the following day

Fall Break: Two day school holiday, generally in October, from after school Wednesday (or the day school recesses) until 9:00 a.m. Monday

Thanksgiving: From after school the day school recesses until return to school

Christmas: From 8:00 p.m. Christmas Eve until return to school
