JOINT CUSTODY PLAN

COMES NOW the Petitioner, [REDACTED] and the Respondent, [REDACTED] and jointly and respectfully submit this Joint Custody Plan ("Plan") agreed upon by and between the parties hereto with supporting affidavits for the Court's consideration, and state as follows: That the terms and provisions of said Plan are in the best interests of the minor child of the parties, namely: [REDACTED] born in March of 2016; that both parties hereto should and shall reasonably confer with one another by the most reasonable and appropriate method, and should and shall attempt share decision-making authority as to important decisions affecting the physical, mental and moral welfare and upbringing of said minor child to arrive at decisions promoting said minor child's best interests.

1. That both parties hereto should and shall attempt to decide jointly the following matters, to-wit:

- A. medical, dental and health care said minor child should or shall receive;
- B. schools which said minor child should or shall attend;
- C. summer camps and church schools and/or classes which said minor child should or shall attend;
- D. fashion and manner in which said minor child should or shall be disciplined;
- E. extent of any travel of said minor child away from home, including purpose, duration, mode, chaperon, etc.;
- F. extra-curricular activities in which the child may be involved
- G. religious instruction said minor child should or shall receive; and
- H. any other areas requiring decisions affecting the growth and development of said minor child.

2. Petitioner shall have visitation with the child every other Monday from 6:30 a.m. until Wednesday at 5:30 p.m., and every other Wednesday from 6:30 a.m. until Friday at 5:30 p.m. Petitioner shall also have visitation on weekends following his Monday – Wednesday visitation from Saturday at 6:30 a.m. until Monday at 5:30 p.m. Respondent shall have physical custody of the child at all other times.

3. The parties further agree to exercise holiday visitation with the minor child pursuant to the Holiday Schedule attached as Exhibit A.

4. The summer physical custody schedule shall remain the same as it is during the school year, except that each party shall be entitled to up to nine (9) consecutive days of uninterrupted visitation during the child's summer recess from school. The parties should work together to ensure that summer vacation schedules and the like are accommodated. In the event of a conflict in summer visitation schedules, Petitioner shall have first pick in even years, and Respondent shall have first pick in odd years.

5. That both parties hereto shall be mindful and considerate of the child's school activities, sports activities, peer activities and associations, and the wishes of the child. In the event of a conflict respecting physical custody or visitation as hereinabove provided, both parties hereto shall work together reasonably in advance to arrange for alternate periods of physical custody or visitation if necessary.

6. The minor child has the right to participate in regularly scheduled extracurricular activities appropriate for her age and the parties have agreed to each pay 50% of any agreed upon activities. Both parents shall make a good faith effort to transport the minor child to activities on time and in appropriate attire even if such activities occur during the child's time with that parent. If the parent is not attending such activity, the parent who drops the child off for such activity has the duty to ensure that the child is picked up from such activity.

7. Each party is to immediately notify the other party if he or she is arrested for any criminal charges other than traffic violations.

8. That both parties hereto agree that the address and telephone number of one another, and those places where the minor child might be temporarily staying should and shall be known to each other at all times, and that each parent shall notify the other immediately of any illness, sickness or emergency that may arise while said minor child is in his or her physical custody.

9. That both parties hereto agree that in the event either party marries, that party's spouse should and shall be apprised of the terms of this Plan, and that party should and shall exert every reasonable effort to ensure that his or her spouse honors and respects the terms, provisions and conditions of said Plan.


10. Each party has the right of first refusal to personally provide the child care services at no cost in the event the other party must make child care arrangements for periods of time exceeding four (4) hours.

10. That any disagreement or dispute arising concerning the care, control, maintenance or management of the child shall be reasonably discussed by and between the parties, and if determined by the parties to be incapable of resolution, the Parties shall refer the issues to mediation prior seeking Court intervention.

WHEREFORE, Petitioner, [REDACTED] and Respondent, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] jointly move the Court to approve the above and foregoing Joint Child Custody Plan as the Court's order in the best interests of the parties' minor child.

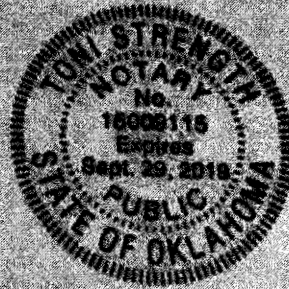

Mother's Day: Mother shall exercise custody from 6:00 p.m. Saturday until 7:00 p.m. Sunday.

Alternating Holidays: All other holidays shall alternate according to the following schedule and shall take precedence over any regular school year or summer vacation schedule.
