

- c. Summer camps not related to daycare, co-curricular activities (related to school, such as band, school sports, etc.) extracurricular activities, church schools, and classes Child should have or attend; Provided that both Parents will consent to:
 - 1. The cost of the activity
 - 2. Whether Child will be enrolled in the activity
 - 3. Who is responsible to take Child to the activity
 - 4. Who will transport Child to the activity
 - 5. And to what extent the other Parent can disagree but the activity still happen (such as one Parent agree to pay all of the activity)
- d. Extent of any travel of Child away from home, including purpose, duration, mode, chaperon(s), etc.;
- e. Religious instruction Child should or shall receive.

4. **Custody Schedule:** Parents agree that in order to ensure continuing association between Child and Parents, and to best promote and foster continued Parent-child relationship, physical custody of Child should and shall be by the schedule of parental access attached. Transportation for the exchanges will be that the Parent gaining custody will pick Child up from the other Parent.

5. **Child's Activities:** Parents agree that they should and shall be mindful and considerate of Child's school activities, sports and extracurricular activities, and peer activities and associations, and the wishes of said Child. In the event of conflict between these activities and the Parental Access Schedule, Parents agree to work together reasonably in advance to alter the Parental Access Schedule if necessary.

6. **Right of First Refusal:**
- a. Each Parent is entitled to the right of first refusal (the right to be the first one to provide child care) when the other Parent is unavailable during his/her periods of Parenting time during the overnight hours.
 - b. Upon remarriage Parents agree that a new spouse may provide child care for all periods of time that do not include overnight. The right of first refusal (the right to be the first one to provide child care) shall always apply when the other Parent will be unavailable overnight during his/her periods of Parenting time.
 - c. A Parent is not considered "unavailable" during his/her periods of Parenting time when Child visits a friend or relative if the Parent having Parenting time is still available, such as when Child spend the night with a friend, or visits grandparents.
 - d. When the other Parent cannot accept Child under either right of first refusal scenarios, then both Parents shall agree on an appropriate caregiver with respect to age and qualifications.

7. **Day-to-Day Decisions:** Parents agree during the period each of them has Child that he/she should and shall decide all normal, regular and routine matters concerning Child's welfare. Each Parent should and shall cooperate with one another in maintaining a mutually supportive arrangement regarding such normal, regular and routine matters.

8. **EMERGENCIES:** In the event of an emergency or life-threatening situation concerning Child, Parents agree to immediately notify each other as soon as possible.

9. **Death or Incapacitation of Parent:** Parents agree that in the event of the death or incapacitation of either Parent, legal and physical custody of Child should and shall vest wholly and exclusively to the other Parent.

10. **New Partners:**

- a. Parents agree that Child should not be exposed to inappropriate adult relationships, and that Child's feelings and sensitivities regarding intimate friendships must be taken into account. Parents will keep each other parent apprised of such relationships, if desired, and have the opportunity to meet such new friends.
- b. Parents agree that they and their friends should conduct themselves in the home and in the presence of Child in such a manner as to maximize Child's psychological comfort, and avoid inappropriate conduct at all times. The parents will model responsible and loving behavior consistent with the values of other educated, liberal adults. In the event of a dispute involving these necessary principles, the parents will submit to accepted, mainstream views in child psychology. An agreed upon child psychologist, such as Donna Boswell, may mediate upon the request and at the expense of either party.
- c. Parents agree that any new partners will not supersede the other Parent's relationship with Child. Only Mother and Father are to be addressed as such unless Child wishes otherwise.
- d. Only Mother and Father shall make Parenting decisions relating to Child. Parents agree to be considerate of Child when including a new partner in activities with Child.
- e. Each Parent agrees to trust in the other Parent's judgment regarding that Parent's conduct as it relates to Child and the new partner.
- f. If one Parent does remarry, then he/she shall apprise the new spouse of the terms of this Joint Child Custody Plan and promote cooperation by the step-Parent.

11. **Communication between Parents:** Parents believe that they should have an opportunity to participate in Child's events. Further they believe that an informed Parent makes the best decisions. Finally, Parents agree that effective Parenting is done with constructive communication between the two Parents. In order to meet those goals the Parents agree to discuss decisions, activities, and problems with the other Parent. The

Parents find the most constructive communication is by texting, email, telephone and face to face conversations.

12. **SAFETY PROVISIONS:** Parents agree that the safety of Child is a priority. Both parties agree to work together for her protection. To achieve this goal, Petitioner and Respondent agree to use good judgment at all times. The expectations that Parents have of each other includes but is not limited to the following:

- a. **Car Safety:**
 - i. Child will always be secured in seat belts when being transported by Petitioner or Respondent.
- b. **Housing:**
 - i. Both Parents shall provide adequate and appropriate housing for Child at all times.
 - ii. Not exposing Child to inappropriate adult romantic relations which may include a bed and sleeping quarters for the Child separate and apart from the Parent.
- c. **High Risk:**
 - i. Child shall not participate in high risk activities without the consent of the other Parent.
- d. **Use of Alcohol and Other Substances:**
 - i. Parents agree to protect Child from being exposed to people who are obviously under the effects of, or engaged in, excess alcohol consumption, inappropriate drug use, or any other dangerous, immoral, or illegal situation or circumstance.
 - ii. Parents agree to never drive with Child while under the influence of any intoxicating substance, prescribed or otherwise.
 - iii. Parents agree not to abuse alcohol or any other drug.
 - iv. Parents will at all times model responsible behavior regarding moderate and responsible use of alcohol, if such is used at all.
- e. **Dangerous People:**
 - i. Parents will protect Child from being exposed to anyone who has been criminally accused of violent behavior or sexually inappropriate behavior.
- f. **Corporal Punishment:** Parents agree that no party will use corporal punishment.

13. **Traveling out of the Country:** Both parties shall cooperate in signing an affidavit to allow for travel outside the United States.

14. **Relocation:** the statute regarding relocation is in the Decree of Dissolution of divorce, and involves certain notification requirements.

15. **Disputes Arising Under the Plan:** Parents agree that any disagreement or dispute arising concerning the care, control, maintenance and management of Child should and shall be mediated by a mediator mutually agreed upon by Parents. Parents recognize that if requested by either Parent, or upon the Court's own motion, the Court may appoint a mediator to help resolve any such disagreement or dispute concerning the interpretation of this agreement. Parents agree that the agreement reached through mediation shall be final and binding on Parents until further order of the Court. Parents recognize that if either or both Parents fail, refuse or neglect to mediate, the Court may terminate this Joint Child Custody Plan. Custody will then be awarded by the Court after a trial on the best interests of Child.


16. **Joint Modification of the Plan:** Parents understand that they may jointly ask the Court to modify this Joint Child Custody Plan in the future; and that if the Court finds it in the best interest of Child, the Court will approve the modifications.

17. **Financial Arrangements:** Parents have made certain agreements as to the sharing of financial responsibilities, all of which are set forth in the Decree of Dissolution.



PARENTAL ACCESS SCHEDULE

All of the below listed times are meant to be flexible. Parents may agree to any schedule which works best for them and Child. **HOWEVER**, in the event of a disagreement between the Parents as to Parenting time, this schedule shall be followed.

WEEKEND AND WEEKDAY PARENTAL ACCESS TIME

1. **MOTHER:** Mother's time with Child shall be:
 - a. From Sunday at 6:00 pm to Tuesday at 6:00 pm
 - b. Alternating Thursday at 6:00 pm to Sunday at 6:00 pm
2. **FATHER:** Father's time with Child shall be:
 - a. From Tuesday at 6:00 pm to Thursday at 6:00 pm
 - b. Alternating Thursday at 6:00 pm to Sunday at 6:00 pm

HOLIDAY AND SPECIAL EVENT PARENTAL ACCESS TIME:

3. **SPRING BREAK:** Spring Break is from 6:00 pm from the day school recesses for Spring Break until 6:00 pm the day before school resumes:
 - a. **Even numbered years:** Father
 - b. **Odd numbered years:** Mother
4. **THANKSGIVING:** Parents will split Thanksgiving day with Father having that Thursday until 2:00 pm. Mother will have 2:00 pm until 8:00 pm. Otherwise the WEEKDAY AND WEEKEND SCHEDULE will remain the same.
5. **WINTER HOLIDAY:** Father shall have every Christmas eve to start at 6:00 pm December 23rd until 10:00 pm December 24th. Mother shall have from December 24th at 10:00 pm until December 25th at 6:00 pm. The WEEKDAY AND WEEKEND SCHEDULE will control the rest of the time for the WINTER HOLIDAY.
6. **BIRTHDAY(S):** For each of the parent's birthdays, that parent, if it is not his/her day, may have the child for dinner from 4:00 pm to 8:00 pm.
7. The holiday Parental access time set forth above takes priority over the regular weekday and weekend Parental access time.
8. **VACATION:** Each Parent may exchange 12 days each year not assigned to them under the WEEKEND AND WEEKDAY PARENTAL ACCESS SCHEDULE. Notice shall be given within 30 days that the parent wants certain nights belonging to the other parent.

MISCELLANEOUS PARENTAL ACCESS TIME:

9. Both Parents shall have liberal phone Parental access time with the Child. This is deemed to include any day of the week between 8:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m.
10. If either Parent travels with the Child out of state then that Parent shall give the other Parent an itinerary of where the Child will be staying, including name, address and phone number.
